As the Executive Administrator, Dr. Caprio was entrusted with full authority over *all operations* of the Center, exceeding that of the Director. Responsibilities include all personnel actions, fiscal matters, and other administrative and managerial affairs. After initiating reorganization at the Center, provided oversight and assistance to the newly appointed Acting Director. Responsible also for monitoring progress of Center staff in implementing changes, as well as to continue examining budget integrity of its Journal. During his appointment, Dr. Caprio successfully eliminated the financial deficit of the publications division and successfully reorganized the academic structure of the Center.
