UNDERGRADUATE MINOR PROGRAMS OF STUDY

The Bloustein School welcomes students in any Rutgers-New Brunswick major to consider our minor programs of study.

The Bloustein School allows students to double major or major/minor across programs. Students in SAS, SEBS and any other professional school need permission from their dean's office. *Please note the requirements will not overlap.*

Students should declare a minor with their matriculating school. They need not apply for minor status with the Bloustein School.

Only courses with a grade of "C" or better can be counted toward the minor program of study.

501: HEALTH ADMINISTRATION (18 cr)

This minor is well-matched to majors in business; economics; human resource management; information technology & informatics; labor studies & employment relations; human resource management; nursing; psychology; pre-medicine/dental tracks; public health; social work; and more.

Students seeking the Health Administration minor must complete three core courses and three 300-level or higher 501 course code electives, excluding those courses open to majors only.

762: PLANNING AND PUBLIC POLICY (24-25 cr)

This minor is well-matched to majors in economics; labor studies & employment relations; political science; pre-law track; geography; sociology; urban planning and design; and more.

Students seeking the Planning and Public Policy minor must complete three core courses and five elective courses in course code 762, four of which must be 300-level or higher, excluding those courses which are open to majors only.

832: PUBLIC HEALTH (24 cr)

This minor is well-matched to majors in environmental policy, institutions & behavior; exercise science; food science; health administration; kinesiology & health; nursing; nutrition; psychology; pre-medicine/dental track; social work; and more.

Students seeking the public health minor must complete three core courses and five 832 elective courses in 832, four of which must be at the 300-level or higher.

833: PUBLIC POLICY (21-22 cr)

This minor is well-matched to majors in criminal justice; economics; labor studies & employment relations; pre-law; political science; sociology; women's & gender studies; and more.

Students seeking the Public Policy minor must complete four core courses and three elective courses in 833, two of which must be at the 300-level or higher.

843: PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT (21 cr)

This minor is well-matched to majors in criminal justice; economics; human resource management; labor studies & employment relations; pre-law track; political science; social work; and more.

Students seeking the public administration and management minor must complete five core courses and two elective courses in 843, which must be at the 300-level or higher.

971: URBAN PLANNING AND DESIGN (18 cr)

This minor is well-matched to majors in art history; civil engineering; environmental science; geography; landscape architecture; sociology; and more.

Students seeking the urban planning and design minor must complete three core courses and three 300-level or higher 971 electives, excluding those courses open to majors only.

975: URBAN STUDIES (18 cr)

This minor is well-matched to majors in sociology; economics; labor studies & employment relations; political science; pre-law track; geography; psychology; ethnic studies; public health; urban planning and design; and more.

Students seeking the Urban Studies minor must complete one core course and five elective courses, four of which must be 300-level or higher.
