Description

APA *PsycInfo* is an electronic bibliographic database that provides abstracts and citations to the scholarly literature in the behavioral sciences and mental health. The database includes material of relevance to psychologists and professionals in related fields such as psychiatry, management, business, education, social science, neuroscience, law, medicine, and social work. *APA PsycInfo* includes indexing for more than 2000 journals, 98% of which are peer-reviewed. Online access to Thesaurus of Psychological Index Terms is included.

APA *PsycArticles* is a database of full-text articles from journals published by the American Psychological Association, the APA Educational Publishing Foundation, the Canadian Psychological Association, and Hogrefe Publishing Group. The database includes all material from the print journals with the exception of ads and editorial board lists. Full-text coverage of 58 journals from 1894 to the present.

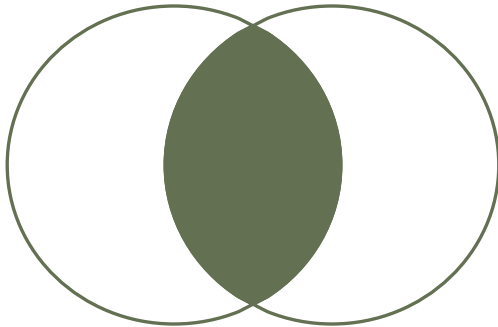

Search Tips

Pair Boolean operators (AND, OR, NOT) with search terms for more specific results.

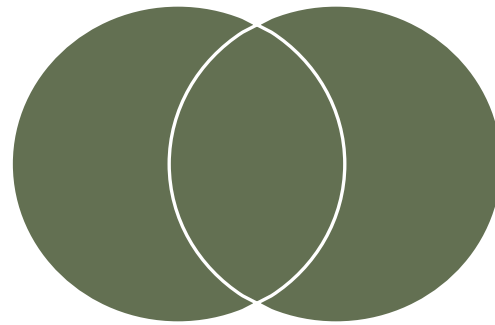
AND

Ex: city planning
AND bicycles



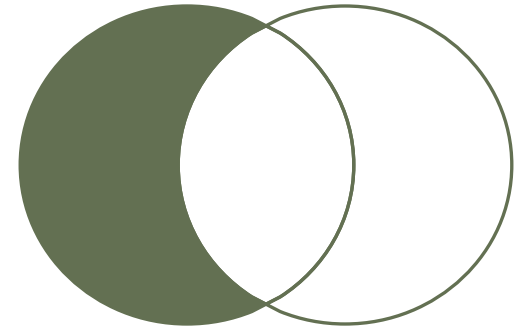
OR

Ex: city planning OR
regional planning



NOT

Ex: motor vehicles
NOT trucks



Search Tips

Use punctuation to create complex search queries.

“ ”

Quotation marks indicate that a phrase should be considered in its entirety.

Ex: “Urban space”

()

Parentheses allow complex queries to be layered.

Ex: China AND (urbanization OR “urban development”)

More Search Tips



Using truncation will retrieve variations of words and is a good way of broadening your search. The asterik is the most common truncation symbol and it directs the database search engine to search for the root word and any ending.

Ex. urban will search for
urban, urbanism, and urbanization*
