Please note that SPRING Orientation for all incoming graduate students will begin virtually on **Thursday, December 15, 2023 at 11:00 AM (EST). All new graduate students for the spring 2023 term are required to attend the opening session on **December 15th**. In addition to this session, individual program sessions will be held on other dates/times and you will be notified when they are arranged.**

With regard to **registering for classes**, we suggest you do so before you arrive. Registration for spring 2023 is currently open and you are encouraged to register yourself at this time. At a minimum, we suggest you register for two or more core courses to activate your student record here at Rutgers. Students of the Bloustein School can add and drop courses through the first week of class without penalty, so please do not worry about making alterations to your schedule. A list of your assigned advisors will be posted to the website in the coming weeks. At that time, feel free to touch base with your advisors prior to your arrival, but be aware that some faculty may not be available to reach until near the start of the term.
