Commencement Pageantry and Color and The Academic Costume

The wearing of academic dress dates back to the early days of the oldest universities in the world. In the American Council on Education's book entitled *American Universities and Colleges*, it is suggested that "Gowns may have been counted necessary for warmth in the unheated buildings frequented by medieval scholars. Hoods seem to have served to cover the tonsured head. . . ."

Throughout the years, European universities have continued to show great diversity in their academic dress. When American universities decided to adopt academic dress, however, they immediately established a code of regulations that today is followed by almost all American institutions. The establishment of this code has made it possible to distinguish between the Bachelors, Masters, and Doctors, and, at the same time, recognize the university that has conferred the degree.

Gowns: The gown for the Bachelor's degree, designed to be worn closed, has pointed sleeves. Graduates of the School of Environmental and Biological Sciences traditionally wear green academic robes, symbolizing the agricultural and environmental elements of the college's mission. The Master's gown, worn open or closed, has oblong sleeves, the front part of which frequently is cut away at the elbow. The Doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves. It is worn open or closed. Cotton poplin or similar material is used for the Master's degree, and rayon or silk ribbed material is used for the Doctor's degree.

Trimmings: Gowns for the Bachelor's or Master's degrees are untrimmed. For the Doctor's degree, the gown is faced down the front with black velvet; three bars of velvet are used across the sleeves. These facings and crossbars may be of velvet of the color distinctive of the disciplines to which the degree pertains, thus agreeing in color with the binding or edging of the hood appropriate to the particular doctor's degree in every instance.

Hoods: The length of the hood worn for the Bachelor's degree must be three feet, for the Master's degree three and one-half feet, and for the Doctor's degree, four feet. The hood worn for the doctor's degree only shall have panels at the sides. All hoods are lined in silk in the academic color or colors of the institution conferring the degree. If the institution has more than one color, the colors are shown in divisions using chevrons. The binding or edge of the hood is usually made of velvet in the color designating the subject in which the degree was granted.

The color or colors of the lining of the hood for the nine colonial colleges are: **scarlet, Rutgers**; crimson, Harvard; green-gold-silver, William and Mary; blue, Yale; red-blue, Pennsylvania; orange-black, Princeton; light blue-white, Columbia; brown, Brown; and green-white, Dartmouth.

Caps: Black mortarboards or soft hats are worn for all degrees. The gold tassel signifies a Doctorate.

Gonfalon: The gonfalon is a heraldic flag or banner, often pointed, swallow-tailed, or with several streamers, and suspended from a crossbar. It is displayed at the head of all formal school processions. Founded in 1992 as the School of Planning and Public Policy, the gonfalon represents the Bloustein School's original graduate-level disciplines of urban planning (brown) and public policy (peacock blue). These colors frame a central stripe of Rutgers Scarlet. Displayed at the top, surrounded by the name of the school, is a representation of the Civic Square Building, which was built in 1995 as the home of the Bloustein School. This year (2022) the school has added gold for the informatics graduate discipline. The colors are represented in the celebratory pom poms presented to all members of the graduating class.

He holds a Ph.D. in Regional Science from the University of Pennsylvania. At the Bloustein School Dr. Lahr taught courses on Global Analytics and occasionally an advanced course on applied statistical methods and economic modeling that is designed for PhD students. Since 1995, Dr. Lahr supervised R/ECON™ research on a broad array of public policy issues in the fields of housing, economic development, program evaluation, and fiscal and economic impact analysis. He has published over 50 articles in journals and edited volumes on economic modeling techniques; development economics; and the economics of various planning and fiscal issues. In addition to being Editor of the journal Economic Systems Research, Lahr sits on the editorial board of Papers in Regional Science, Journal of Economic Structures, and the Brazilian Review of Regional Studies, He has co-edited four books and two journal special issues. He is presently Treasurer of the Benjamin H. Stevens Graduate Fellowship of the North American Regional Science Council. Lahr also has been Vice President of the International-Input Output Association, Chair of the North American Regional Council, and President of the Southern Regional Science Association, and sat on the Editorial Boards of the Journal of Regional Science and Economic Systems Research. He has received service awards from the North American Regional Science Association International and the Southern Regional Science Association. He has also been proclaimed a Research Fellow of the Southern Regional Science Association.

Associate Research Professor and Associate Dean of Academic Administration **Marc D. Weiner** started his career with the Bloustein School June 2006. He also served as the school's Faculty Director of Undergraduate Education. Dr. Weiner was appointed by the Chancellor's Selection Committee as a Fellow for the 2020-2021 convening of the Big Ten Academic Alliance Department Executive Officers Seminar and was a 2019-2020 Fellow of the Rutgers Leadership Academy. He was an Affiliate of Rutgers, New Brunswick's School of Arts and Sciences. He also previously served as Associate Director of the Bloustein Center for Survey Research, as well as Project Director for the Office of Population Research, and Assistant Director for the Survey Research Center, both at Princeton University. Dr. Weiner was the founding President of the New Jersey-Pennsylvania Chapter of the American Association for Public Opinion Research and served on the Executive Council of the Association of Academic Survey Research Organizations. He is the recipient of the Bloustein School's Jerome G. Rose Excellence in Teaching Award, the Graduate Faculty Teaching Award from the Rutgers School of Graduate Studies; and was profiled for excellence in teaching by the American Political Science Association's Campus Teaching Award Interview Series in PSNow. Dr. Weiner earned his doctorate in political science from Rutgers, New Brunswick in May 2005; he studied political methodology at the Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research (ICPSR) at the University of Michigan and at the Princeton School of Public and International Affairs (1998), has a juris doctor from Widener University (1986) and a bachelor's degree in political philosophy from Syracuse University (1982). Before returning to the academy, from 1986 through 1996, he practiced trial law in the New Jersey state and federal courts. During that time, he served as a law clerk in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Law Division, was certified as a New Jersey Department of Public Advocacy special mediator, and as a special hearing officer for the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development.

In Memoriam

Senior Policy Fellow James J. Florio, former Governor of New Jersey and an eight-term congressman, passed away on September 25, 2022. Gov. Florio joined the Bloustein School as a Senior Policy Fellow shortly after the conclusion of his gubernatorial term in 1994, teaching graduate students for decades. Public policy development, like everything else, changed significantly over the past few decades. Noting that state and federal governments were in a period of transformational change of policy, he impressed upon his students that rather than marginal modifications — which could be disruptive and dislocating — systemic change was needed to meet citizen expectations. In his classes, he reviewed how current administrations were coping with change using traditional policy analysis as well as extensive comparative review of current events and policy developments over the past three decades.

“Governor Florio was a principled and effective policy advocate. During his long career — as a community organizer, state legislator, member of Congress, and Governor — he held firm to core values. He believed deeply in the power of government to transform the lives of those most in need and the courage to fight for policies even at the risk of his political career,” said Carl Van Horn, Distinguished Professor of Public Policy and director of the Heldrich Center for Workforce Development at Rutgers University, who served as Governor Florio’s Director of Policy from 1990 to 1992. “His leadership provides inspiration and a role model for public servants and for future leaders graduating from the Bloustein School.”

The Bloustein School was saddened to lose two former students from its close-knit community in 2022-23. Both were bright and vibrant members of the Bloustein School and Rutgers University during their time here and will be greatly missed. Our deepest condolences go to their family and friends. Both alumni are being recognized with their degrees today.

Master’s student and alumnae **Jennifer H. Elliott** passed away in April 2023. Fueled by a constantly questioning mind, a passion for music, advocacy, teaching, and research, and possessing a unique ability to creatively problem solve, Jenn graduated *magna cum laude* from Rider University with a Bachelor of Arts in both Music and Elementary Education before joining Rutgers in the Fall of 2019. At Rutgers, Jenn completed her Master of Public Affairs and Politics (MPAP) degree at the Bloustein School in 2022. An advocate for social justice and for developing public policies to help those with severe health problems, Jenn is being remembered today.

Andrew J. Wainwright, master’s student, and alumnus passed away in April of 2022. A graduate of the Master of City and Regional Planning (MCRP) in 2019, the loss was felt greatly throughout his cohort, especially by those crossing the stage at the Jersey Mike’s Arena that May. A stellar student in the program, Andrew’s focus on transportation planning and policy led him to start the career he envisioned.
